As musicologist Alberto Basso has put it: "The Mass in B minor is the consecration of a whole life." The performance features the magnificent British vocal ensemble VOCES8 on their first Australian tour, and Australian conductor Benjamin Bayl, co-founder of the Australian Romantic and Classical Orchestra.

Sergei Diaghilev's Ballets Russes changed the history of ballet and the history of music too. Stravinsky composed all of his early landmark ballet scores for Diaghilev's company, including Petrushka. It's all energy. lyricism, playfulness and pathos, wrapped up in kaleidoscopic orchestral colours: it doesn't take much imagination to see Petrushka and the Ballerina in their fairground tale of love and jealousy. Romantic pursuit lies at the heart of de Falla's El sombrero de tres picos also: the miller's attractive young wife is being pursued by the pompous old magistrate, whose amorous designs are eventually undone, to music of ravishing beauty and fiery rhythms. The ballet from Borodin's opera *Prince Igor* was one of the Ballets Russes' first great successes; the treasure-chest of memorable melodies in these Polovtsian Dances makes for a dynamic curtain-raiser.

Gábor Takács-Nagy is the complete musician; a founding member of the Takács Quartet, he has gone on to become an inspirational conductor and teacher of chamber music performance. In this sumptuous concert, he directs ANAM musicians in a banquet of music from one of the golden ages of music in Vienna. Mozart composed his miraculous Symphony no. 25 when he was just 17; Haydn's jubilant Symphony no. 90 on the other hand, is a product of the composer's rich maturity, by which time his fame had spread through Europe. Beethoven's rarely-heard Overture honours Hungary's first king, while Schubert's delicious Overture is better known as the one to the play Rosamunde: a publisher appropriated it for that purpose decades after Schubert's death.

This festive opening concert to the 2019 ANAM season begins with not one but two fanfares: Richard Strauss', created for the inaugural Vienna Philharmonic Ball in 1924, and the equally spectacular one from Wagner's opera Lohengrin. The festivities then move from multiple brass to multiple pianos for British composer Graham Fitkin's funky Flak, which has a neat trick up its sleeve it only uses the pianos' white notes. But there's definitely something dark (and spooky) about the transcription of Saint-Saëns' Danse macabre for four pianists, created by the composers' friend Ernest Guiraud. Grainger described his Random round as "an experiment in concerted partial improvisation," and it's full of rich humour and outdoor spirit. The concert grows in size as it nears its conclusion, firstly for the double wind quintet by the man Yehudi Menuhin described as the greatest musician he'd ever met, George Enescu; then for Ernest Bloch's shining tribute to the spirit of the Baroque, and finally for the joyous overture to Glinka's fairy-tale opera.

This brass-centred showcase focuses on music by four 20th century masters, including rarely-played music by Ravel's contemporary Albert Roussel. You'll also experience four ages of Stravinsky; his 1950s Septet, which marked a bold change in his compositional priorities; one of his happiest works of the 1920s, his Octet; his gentle, youthful Pastorale and his Symphonies of Wind Instruments. Hindemith's Konzertmusik is a piano concerto in all but name, in which the soloist engages in powerful exchanges with harps and brass. Bernd Alois Zimmermann's work is a playful transformation of the kind of tunes one might dance to at a village fair in the Rhineland.

This sonic spectacular for percussion and plural pianos includes four 20th century classics – works so dynamic they could have been written yesterday. Bartók's fascination for the combination of keyboards and percussion reached its climax in this Sonata. The Rite of Spring, too, has lost none of its power since its riotous premiere in 1913, and this fascinating arrangement throws new light on the score's visceral rhythmic impulses. Xenakis' Persephassa of 1969 spreads the six percussionists around the performing space, creating a true sonic spectacle, while, in its simplicity and power, Reich's Clapping Music, from 1972, represents a seminal moment in the history of minimalism – using only the kind of percussive effects created by hands clapping.

Two modern American classics to open: John Adams' jubilant Hallelujah Junction, inspired by the name of a truck stop near the California-Nevada border, and a seminal work of minimalism. Steve Reich's Six Pianos. On the other hand, the epic riff on Chopin's Prelude by young, New Mexico-born composer Ben Wallace might be called 'So Chopin walked into a bar, ordered a whiskey and headed straight for the pinball machine.' One has to hear it to believe it. Likewise the epic arrangement of Mussorgsky's musical art gallery which pianist/composer Paul Kerekes created for New York's Piano Band. Kerekes is a member of the group as is Lisa Moore who returns to ANAM to direct this spectacular program.

"The birds were my teachers," says composer John Luther Adams, whose music is a natural extension of his long-time environmental activism. Birds have inspired composers from Mozart to Messiaen; in Adams' case, it was hearing the song of a wood thrush for the first time that set him on his path as a composer inspired by the beauty and majesty of the natural world. In Adams' words, Ten Thousand Birds is not a fixed composition, but "an atlas of musical possibilities for performers to use in creating their own unique realisations of the music." This ambitious, rarely-performed work - a true musical event - will be led by Tim Munro, ANAM Alumnus and former flautist in contemporary musical supergroup Eighth Blackbird.

Under the direction of Stefan Dohr, Principal Horn of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra, this program takes us on a journey from Mozart's Vienna to 21st-century Paris; for, as Romantic as they are, the works by the young Richard Strauss, and Liszt's pupil Joachim Raff, are infused with the spirit of Mozart's wind music. Berio's piece is a set of fractured fairy tales for speaker and wind quintet: stories of chickens, fawns, mice and cats that don't quite go where you expect them to. There is also a powerful sense of theatre to the work by the contemporary French composer Vinko Globokar. Like Strauss and Raff, Brett Dean does some subtle time-travelling in his Three Pieces, music written for, and inspired by, the Berlin Philharmonic's horn section, which takes as its starting point Mahler's haunting writing for horns in his Symphony no. 3.

In the history of music there can be few examples of a composer 'exceeding the brief' with results as astounding as Schubert in his Octet. It was commissioned by one of the composer's patrons, Count Ferdinand von Troyer, a talented amateur clarinettist who had played in the premiere of Beethoven's celebrated Septet some 20 years earlier. He suggested Schubert compose a companion piece for Beethoven's work, which he did faithfully – while also creating one of the richest works in all of chamber music. Who better to lead ANAM musicians in this masterpiece of lyrical beauty than Noah Bendix-Balgley, First Concertmaster of the Berlin Philharmonic Orchestra?

Clara Schumann was one of the great musicians of the 19th century. Acclaimed for her pianism by the crowned heads of Europe in her 20s. she went on to become one of the most respected performers and teachers of her age, in a life in which she was also a composer, wife and muse to Robert Schumann, mother to their eight children and, after Schumann's death, mentor and muse to Brahms. Her few compositions have a unique, poetic beauty, which will be celebrated in this concert to mark the 200th anniversary of her birth. This glorious program concludes with music Robert dedicated to - and was first performed by - Clara, and the first work ever composed for piano and string quartet. The joyous, passionate Piano Quintet is one of Robert Schumann's masterpieces.

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


